Monthly Newsletter Good News for Haiti

While violent gangs still control much of Port au Prince, there is good news from on the ground in Haiti. The airport has reopened and, according to Father Raymond, food is more readily available now (although it is still very expensive). There is hope that the security situation will improve, as well. After many delays, over 1,000 Kenyan police offiers are expected to arrive in Haiti the last week in June, 2024. Jamaica, Benin and Bangledesh are also scheduled to send troops. They are all sponsored by the United Nations and will help to bolster the local police forces.

In mid-June the new prime minister, Gary Conille, attended a graduation ceremony at the police academy in Port au Prince for 400 new officers. Conille was appointed Prime Minister at the end of May 2024. He previously served as the Haititan Prime Minister from 2011-2012, and most recently was the Regional Director for Latin America and the Caribbean at UNICEF. He and his new cabinet will work on a plan for holding elections in 2025. (News from articles on Associated Press, MSN and Miami Herald websites posted in late May and late June 2024.)
